



## **VANCOUVER ISLAND UNIVERSITY**

### **WINTER ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE PROGRAM “Canadian Culture and Winter Recreation” January 15 – February 8, 2019**

Vancouver Island University (VIU) invites students to attend a 4-week English Language and Culture Program, scheduled to take place at the VIU Nanaimo Campus from January 15<sup>th</sup> to February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The program will focus specifically on Canadian culture and winter recreation.

#### **VANCOUVER ISLAND UNIVERSITY**

Vancouver Island University is a government-funded institution located on central Vancouver Island in British Columbia, Canada. Currently, more than 10,000 full-time students are enrolled in academic, technical, and vocational programs, and more than 25,000 students take general interest courses on an annual basis. VIU delivers educational programs in four campus locations, with the main campus in Nanaimo. Nanaimo is on the scenic east coast of Vancouver Island in the heart of western British Columbia’s tourism area. With a high standard of living, Nanaimo is a city of 90,000 people and has a mild climate, which allows for a variety of summer and winter recreational activities.

VIU has a long history of involvement in international education, and has assisted individuals and groups from many countries with specialized courses and custom programs. In addition, the VIU Faculty of International Education caters solely to international students and offers extensive services, including dedicated advising and counseling, an English Language Centre with highly-trained English language instructors, extensive cultural and activity offerings, and a “Safe Harbour” building where students are offered comfortable classrooms, a general gathering area, and welcoming staff and faculty.

#### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

Upon arrival at VIU, students will be tested to assess their English language skills. More than one level will be offered if there is sufficient enrollment. Throughout the program, students will participate in English classes (20 hours of instruction per week) with plenty of opportunity to practice their speaking skills, as well as learn about Canadian culture. Students will be required to complete a selection of short assignments, and may be required to complete a research project. Throughout the program, students will participate in a variety of recreational activities that reflect the program theme and give the opportunity to experience Canadian culture firsthand. A Certificate of Completion will be given to students at the end of the program. A full program outline is included in attached Appendix A.

## HOMESTAY ACCOMMODATION

Homestay provides an opportunity for students to learn about Canadian family life and customs. Students are able to practice their English and receive help in a variety of areas that can be confusing to newcomers. Host families involve our program participants in their everyday activities and include them as members of their families. The students will have a comfortable room and be **provided with breakfast, lunch and dinner**. Most students will have to commute by public transport to VIU (all homes are within 1-hour commute time to the University), therefore students will be required to purchase a bus pass. Students will be placed one or two per home depending upon host family availability at the time of confirmation of student numbers (required **8 weeks** before program start).

**\$29 CAD per night per student:** Homestay Rent
